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
The School


Faculty & Administration

They have appointed an Interim Head of School to lead the institution until the permanent Head of School assumes their role on June 1, 2024. This team comprises key positions such as the Director of Admissions, the Director of Finance, and the Director of Operations. Location

Brownsville, Texas is situated on the southernmost tip of Texas and is a vibrant city with a rich cultural heritage. It's a gateway to the Mexican border and a hub of international trade. Brownsville manages to maintain a sense of close-knit community, with charming neighborhoods and access to breathtaking natural landscapes that celebrate the region's history and diversity. The city is proud of its multi-cultural heritage and hosts events like Charro Days, highlighting its Mexican roots.



The Position


A Head of School is responsible for the overall performance of his/her school, managing the operations, and supervising the teachers, students, and administrative staff.

- Serving as the public face of the school, communicating with parents, employees, and the community
- Ensuring all accreditation requirements are met
- Overseeing all school events
- Communicating with The Church of the Advent Rector
